

# Pirates Show Offensive Punch With 81-28 Win over Smyrna

## Llewellyn Phillips Chosen Candidate For Scholarship

Llewellyn Phillips, son of Mr. and Mrs. Llewellyn Phillips, Morehead City, has been selected as Carteret's candidate for the John M. Morehead scholarships.

Phillips is a senior at Morehead City High School. Twelve boys from the county were interviewed by the county committee. Seven were from Morehead City.

Phillips will now be interviewed by the district committee, and if successful there will advance to final interviews for the scholastic awards.

The scholarships have been established by John M. Morehead III, Rye, N. Y., an alumnus of the University of North Carolina.

Stevie Mason was the big gun in the scoring column with 29 points. Roger Harris netted 23 markers for second place in the Atlantic scoring figures.

Bobby Nelson, who scored 10 points, was the outstanding playmaker on the floor, according to his coach. Roy Cockerham said, "Bobby must have had 20 assists last night. His ball handling and passing were really sharp. He looked like a real star."

George Golden hit nine points, Sammy Salter hit for six and Dennis Harvey bagged four for Atlantic. Tom Barrett, David Hammer and Van McIntosh failed to score.

The only bright spot for Smyrna was the performance of center Glenn Willis. The big man scored 20 of the 28 points his team made

and was a hard scrapper under the backboards.

Wade, Davis, Gomans and Nelson scored two points each for Smyrna. Blue Devil substitutes were Hancock, Lawrence, Mears, Piner and Silbus.
