Hawks Advance **To Final Bout**

Sammy Lilly scored 31 points to lead the Newport Hawks to an 83-58 win over Pamlico in Carteret-Pamlico conference tournament play Friday night. It was Newport's third victory against the Hurricanes this season.

Forward David Garner tossed in 17 points for the Hawks. Ray Avery got 15; Skip Johnson, 6; Mike Joyce and Leon Murdoch, 4 each; Kenny Mann and Norman Dunn, 2 each; Jimmy Aycock and Pat Joyce, 1 each. They hit 58 per cent from the floor, and picked up 7 points in 13 foul shots for 54 per cent.

Newport outscored the Pamlico cagers in every quarter: first, 21 to 17; second, 18 to 16; third, 24 to 13; and fourth, 20 to 12. The Hawks made 38 field goals to Pamlico's 19, a double score from the floor.

Rice and Whitfield scored 16 each to lead the Hurricanes. Venters accounted for 10; Clarke, 7; Brinson, 6; Eastwood, 2; and Lup-ton, 1. They hit 20 of 34 field goal attempts for 59 per cent, but made only 7 field goals in the entire second half.

Lilly and Mike Joyce led the Hawks in rebounding, with 11 each. The boys were cited as Newport's outstanding defenders. The win placed Newport in Sat-urday night's final tournament bout against Smyrna.

The win, Beaufort's third over the Eagles this season, gave the Seadogs the tournament title and trophy. Guard Clem Woodard poured in

Robert McLean, Morchead's 6foot, 7-inch center, was high for the Eagles, with 22 points. Rodney Kemp and John Lee got 12 each; Cecil Sewell, 8; Baxter Brittingham, 3; and George Dill, 2. Kemp hit 5 for 5 from the floor, and turned in an equally perfect game on defense. He was the game's outstanding performer. McLean collected three fouls in

the first period and another in the second. The Eagles' gunner sat out the entire third quarter. Tommy Johnson, standing in for coach Gannon. Talbert, sent the tall center back into the game with two minutes gone in the final period.

Brittingham and McLean fouled out in the closing moments of the game. Beaufort's Mickey Bertram collected his fifth foul with seconds to go, but finished the game officials at the after scorer's table neglected to sound the buzzer.

Scoring for Beaufort in the fourth quarter were Way, 5 points: Woodard, 4; Stanley, 4; and Pake, 2. Eleven of the Sea-dogs' 15 points in the final period was scored from the free-throw The Eagles were charged line. with two technical fouls in the first half.

Pake led Beaufort under the boards, with 11 rebounds. Woodard hauled in another 6. McLean cleared 13 for Morehead. Lee, Kemp and Sewell snagged 3 re-bounds each.
