Smyrna-Hi Sweeps Two Exhibition Tilts

Smyrna-Harkers Island continued along the undefeated path in exhibition contests as they swept two games over the weekend, defeating the Coast Guard 17-3 Saturday, and Atlantic 14-1 on Sunday.

Wilson Davis went the route in the Saturday victory, which was a seven-inning contest.

Jamie Lewis and Don Coates shared the mound duties on Sunday for the winners. For the losers Rodney Smith started, with Joe Willis, Johnny Willis and Gary Morris appearing in relief.

Smyrna's red-hot baseball team will play host to the Morehead City Eagles this afternoon at 3 p.m.

In their last outing at Atlantic, Coach Stew Daniels' nine rolled up a 14-1 victory last Thursday.

Kenny Davis went the distance for the winners, striking out 12, walking four and allowing but five safeties.

Howard Pittman went the route for the losers and gave up 17 hits as he walked two and struck out three.

The victory was the fifth of the season for the Smyrna team, with their lone loss of the campaign coming at the hands of the Morehead City team.

Bruce Babbitt and Ron Styron were the big guns in the hitting attack for the Smyrna team, each having 3-4. John Ingram and Glenn Arthur each had 3-5. All three of Babbitt's safeties were doubles.

Sammy Salter was the leading sticker for the loser with 2-2.

Smyrna started the scoring parade in the top of the first with four tallies, and Atlantic retaliated with a singleton.

Smyrna continued their scoring parade with four in the second, four more in the fourth and single tallies in both the fifth and sixth frames.
