

Midget All-Stars Clash To

It what may be the stepping stone to the state Midget football championship, the Morehead City Midget All-Stars meet the Jacksonville All-Stars tomorrow night at Camp Glenn field at 8. The game is the first round of the state playoffs and is for the Eastern District championship.

Festivities accompanying

the game will get under way tomorrow morning with a parade through downtown Morehead City. Featured in the parade will be queen contestants, bands, floats and football players. The parade will form at the high school at 10 and will start at 11. The route of the parade, starting from the high school, will be south on 12th street, west on Arendell to 17th, east on Arendell to 7th, west on Arendell to 12th and north on 12th to the school.

On Saturday afternoon players from both teams will be weighed in in compliance with the North Carolina State Recreation Society rules. The state rules specify that no player may weigh more than 115 pounds. George Jackson, vice-commissioner of the Morehead City Football Boosters club and chairman of the All-Star game, will preside over the weigh-in.

During halftime of the game the name of the Midget football queen will be announced by Mayor George Dill. The queen will be crowned by the Morehead City high school varsity queen Lynette McBride. Queen candidates will be presented to the fans prior to the game at 7:30. Mrs. James Shine Jr. and Miss Renee Kemp are in charge of events to select the queen.

The Morehead City high school band, under the direction of Ralph Wade, will play during the game and halftime ceremonies.

All-Star coaches Robert Barnum and John Davis report their 33-man squad in top shape and ready for the big game. The squad has been working out for the last three weeks in preparation for Jacksonville. Barnum and Davis have been pleased with their charges' showings in practices.

The winner of tomorrow night's game advances to the second round of the playoffs against the winner of the Raleigh-Burlington clash. If Morehead City defeats Jacksonville, the second round game will also be played here.

Yesterday, Barnum stated that he is looking forward to the game and feels that if they can get by Jacksonville his team can go all the way in the playoffs.

County Hosts Midget Playoff Tilt

Another milestone will be reached in county football tomorrow night when the Morehead City Midget All-Stars play host to the Jacksonville All-Stars in the first round of the state playoffs for the Midget title.

This will be the first time that a county Midget team has ever been involved in the state playoffs and the first time that such a game has been played here. Should Morehead City defeat Jacksonville, they will advance to the second round of the playoffs and meet the winner of the Raleigh-Durham game Nov. 26. That game also would be played in Morehead City.

The Midget football program is still relatively new in Morehead City and Carteret county. It got its start only last year and already has proven to be highly successful. The long hours of hard work and expenditure of money has been worthwhile.

Members of the Morehead City Football Boosters club are making every effort to make tomorrow night's game one of the big sports attractions of the year. Highlights of the day will be a big Homecoming parade, the crowning of a queen and the game itself.

Dr. Robert Barnum and John Davis are the two All-Star coaches and they will have a 33-man team ready to go against Jacksonville. Members of the All-Star team were selected from the league's four teams at a recent coaches' meeting.

Strict state recreation society rules will be followed in the game. An official weigh-in for players will be held prior to the game. The weight limit for Midget gridders is 115 pounds and any player exceeding this will not be allowed to play. The weigh-in will probably be held at the West End fire station due to the fact that the Jacksonville team will be housed at Bud Dixon's motel.

In the event that the game ends in a tie, rules call for a 3-minute sudden-death overtime period. If, at the end of the overtime, the score remains tied, the team that has compiled the most offensive yardage will be declared the winner.

Midget officials are hoping for a large turnout of fans at the game. Midget football has proven to have great spectator appeal and the game tomorrow night promises to be doubly exciting. The Midget stars of today are the varsity stars of tomorrow so why not come out and see the 1964 Eagle team in action? You won't be sorry.
