

# SUNDAY GAME WAS WON BY BEAUFORT

## Potter's Timely Single in The Sixth Chased Two Over the Plate to Bring Victory to Locals

Newport collected but five base knocks off Longest in his six inning mound sojourn and three of these came in the sixth to account for three tallies and put them one ahead of Beaufort. Lewis' triple with two on was the feature.

Brooks hit two for two to pace Beaufort to be closely followed by Hartsell with two for four and G. Hassell with one for two. L. Garner was best for the losers with two for the losers with two for four. Culpepper and Smith pitched for Newport and were picked for a total of eight safeties.

A continual shower made things unpleasant and the ball especially hard to handle, each team committing four errors and a total of ten bases on balls being issued for the day, seven by Newport flingers. G. Hassell furnished the fielding features. He had eleven chances at second base, missing one of them. Henderson caught for the visitors and E. Potter for the locals. The Beaufort team was again under the guidance of C. Hassell who played first and third.
