

Devil Pups Blanked On 2 Hits by Piner

The Smyrna Blue Devils turned seven hits into seven runs Wednesday afternoon to post a 7-0 win over the Camp Lejeune Devil Pups in a baseball game played at Smyrna.

Braxton Piner chalked up the win for the Blue Devils as he pitched near-flawless two-hit ball. The crafty southpaw had the Devil Pup batters eating out of his hand most of the day as he recorded his fifth win of the year. A single in the second inning by Fridley and another single in the sixth by Aycock were the lone Camp Lejeune safeties. Piner whiffed seven and walked three.

The Devil Pups used three hurlers in the game with starter Pruitt

taking the loss. The Blue Devils got to Pruitt in the third frame scoring two runs for a 2-0 lead.

Pactow relieved Pruitt and gave up one run in the fourth and two more in the sixth while being tagged for three hits. McKinzie, the third Devil Pup hurler of the day, yielded the final two Blue Devil runs.

Piner also gave the Blue Devils a big hand at the plate as he pounded out two hits in four trips and drove in three runs. Vaughn Yeomans and freshman Doug Dameron also collected a pair of hits apiece.

Smyrna's next encounter with the Devil Pups will be in a two-night doubleheader at Camp Lejeune May 3.

Blue Devils Withstand Pirate Homer Barrage
