## Asheboro Outfit Scores In Sixth Inning To Beat Lucky Strikes By 2 To 0

Johnson Singles To Drive In Both Markers As Calloway Bests Allen In Mound Duel—Eagles Will Represent State In National Meet

Greensboro, July 15.—(AP)—The McCrary Eagles, of Asheboro, scored two runs in the sixth inning here tonight and won the North Carolina semi-pro baseball championship by defeating the Lucky Strikes, of Durham, 2-0 in Memorial stadium before a crowd of 8,000 fans.

The Lucky Strike team was undefeated until last night when they bowed to McCrary Eagles making an additional game necessary. Lucky Strike had defeated McCrary in the first game of the tourney on July 1, the only defeat the Eagles suffered.

Had Lucky Strike won the game last night, the tourney would have ended then with the Luckies champion. The McCrary Eagles will represent North Carolina in the national semi-pro tourney in Wichita, Kas., August 13-26.

### REAL MOUND BATTLE

Tonight's contest was a beautiful mound duel between Calloway of the state champions, and Allen. The former allowed seven hits, two of them doubles, while the Lucky Strike righthander permitted only six blows, all singles. Calloway struck out nine while Allen fanned four. Each issued four bases on balls.

The battle was decided in the sixth when Johnson drove out a single with Harrington and Check, both of whom had hit, on the sacks. Before and after that time Allen was in no danger. Johnson and Harrington secured four of McCrary's six hits, each getting two bingles. Hunter paced the Luckies' attack with two hits.

That same old Davidson jinx seemed to reign over the Devils as they failed to connect with the ball, while the Davidson club took advantage of the Duke pitcher's wildness and also bunched their hits to score a 5 to 0 win.

Lee Hawkins, who probably started the last game of his college career, was unusually wild and although he gave up only six hits his wildness accounted for part of the scoring.
