## TO THE EDITOR:

I would like to reply to your reprint of the editorial on banning Little League parents from ball games.

I think it is great when parents show up at ball games and support and show interest in their children and what they are doing — the kids know they care.

What concerns me more is the kid who never has a parent come to the game, who seems to live at the Little League field because that seems to be the only place where someone does care for them.

If those who are concerned with criticizing Little League parents for their interest in the children want to do something positive to help, all they have to do is show up at the field, take an interest in the program and by their presence and good example demonstrate proper decorum. A good league official or umpire can always handle an overzealous adult. I've seen it done often enough.
