In Defensive Play

Beaufort downed the Havelock fe Rams 58-48 Friday night at Jackb sonville in what turned out to be the Seadogs' toughest contest of the District II single-A tournag ment.

The win advanced Beaufort to Saturday night's final bout with Mount Olive, and the eventual championship.

Clem Woodard led the Seadogs in scoring, with 17 points. Brady Way tossed in 14; Richard Stanley, 13; Chris Pake and Mickey Bertram, 7 each. They made 18 of 49 from the floor for 37 per cent, and 22 of 24 from the line for 92 per cent.

Havelock's 6-foot, 7-inch center, Gene Cathey, won game high honors, with 29 points. Joe Laufer added 13; Clark Totherow, 5; Ronnie Padrick, 2; and Bill Bur-chette, 1. They hit 17 of 44 field goal attempts for 39 per cent, and 14 of 22 foul shots for 64 per cent. Beaufort outscored the Rams

14 to 9 in the first period, 17 to 15 in the third, and 20 to 11 in the fourth. The Seadogs' 7-point lead at the half, 31-24, was cut to one point, 38-37, going into the final period, with Havelock out-scoring them 13 to 7 in the third. Beaufort picked up most of its

fourth-quarter points from the free-throw line, after freezing the

ball at every opportunity. Brady Way led in rebounding, with 8. Chris Pake brought down 7; Richard Stanley, 5; Clem Woodard, 4; and Mickey Bertram, 3. The Rams' big center was credited with only 9. Bertram was cited as Beaufort's outstanding defender in Friday night's game, as well as in Saturday's clash with Mount Olive.
