

West Suffers 6-0 Defeat At Jacksonville

Jacksonville blanked West High 6-0 Wednesday on the Cardinals' home field. Wayne King pitched the no-hit contest, a make-up game, doubled in two runs and scored a third himself.

The Cardinals picked up four runs in the second inning. Losing pitcher John Lee walked two, and watched them cross home plate on a throwing error by West's third baseman.

Another walk and another error at third put two men on base. King's double scored both.

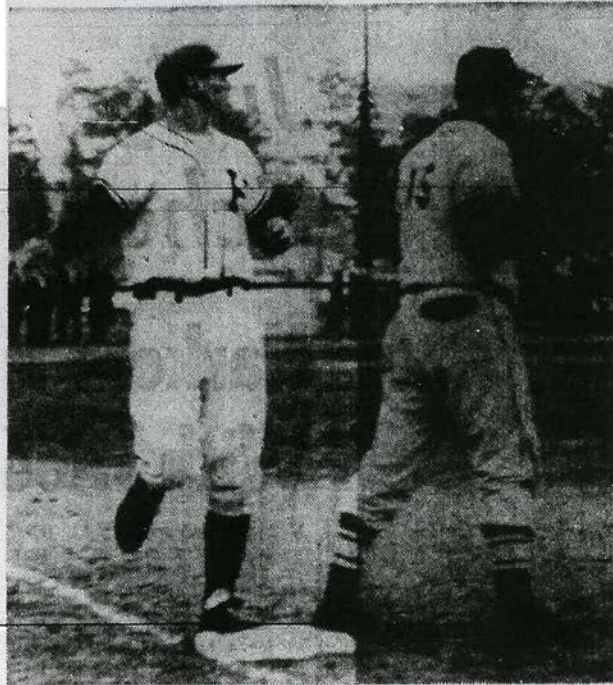
A single by Jacksonville's Singletary, a stolen base and an error on West's first baseman gave the Cardinals one more in the third. They got their final run in the fourth, on a walk, an error and a single by Kast.

Lee was relieved in the fourth by Ray Salter. Ronnie Zubovic took over in the sixth. Together, they gave up three hits, walked eight and struck out six.

King went the distance for Jacksonville, striking out eight, walking two and giving up no hits.

Jacksonville is 2-1 so far, with wins over West and Washington and a loss to Camp Lejeune. The Patriots are 0-3.

Havelock scored a whopping 12-2 victory over Smyrna Tuesday afternoon. The contest, played at Havelock, was the Rams' opener.

Ray Hardison was credited with the win. He relieved starter Fred Fritz in the first inning, after the Blue Devils picked up a quick two runs. Phil Buzzelli, Havelock's leading hitter (a .420 average last season) finished on the mound.

Tommy McGee drove in the Blue Devils two runs. Ted Lewis and Jimmy Bradford walked, moved up on a wild pitch, then scored on a single by McGee.

Keith Piner took the pitching loss. He gave up five runs in the bottom of the first, before being

relieved by Kenny Lewis. Arnold Davis stepped in the third, allowed two walks, four hits and another five runs.

The Rams collected a total seven runs in the first, on two singles, three walks, two errors and a home run by Clark Totherow. They scored four more in the fourth, on two hits, a walk, fielder's choice, an error and a hit batsman.

Buzzelli got No. 12, a home run in the sixth inning.

The loss gives Smyrna a 1-2 record so far.
