

Erwin Gets Eighth Straight Win As Bottlers Bow, 11 To 3

Cole and Mitchell Lead Loop Leaders In Dull Engagement

Sparked by Odell Cole and Pitcher Doc Mitchell, Erwin Auditorium remained undefeated in the City Baseball League last night by defeating Coca-Cola, 11 to 3, at Durham Athletic Park. This was the eighth consecutive league triumph for Cocky Bennett's Wildcats.

Cole, leftfielder, slapped out a single, double and a pair of triplets while Mitchell pounded out a two bagger and two singles to walk off with willow honors.

The winners scored a lone marker in the initial frame and came back in the third to tally three runs and put the game on ice.

Mitchell toiled seven innings for the winners before he was relieved by Pilot Bennett. While he worked, Mitchell fanned 13 batters and was touched for only four safeties.

Mitchell Allen started for the Bottlers but was shelled from the mound in the sixth act after Erwin had banged out nine safeties.

Leading Doodle Wilkie's Bottlers was Junis Beck, who collected two singles and a double in four tries.

Although the weather was hardly fit for baseball three veteran Duke southpaws, Jenkins, Hawkins, and Belue, portended the frosh to death giving up only one hit in the nine innings.
All three of the varsity pitchers looked good in the box. Jenkins touched for the lone hit of the day for the freshmen by Robert Shaw but hurled great baseball otherwise. Hawkins entered the box in the fourth inning, walked one batter, two others got on by errors and then he struck out the next six batters to face him.
