

Blue Devils Give New Coach Double Victory

The Smyrna Blue Devils handed their new coach, Harry Thomas Sanders, a double victory over the Beaufort Seadogs at Smyrna Tuesday night. The girls won the opener on a last second field goal by Serina Davis, 39-37. The boys won more easily as they took a 50-39 decision.

Davis and Elberta Gillikin netted 15 points each for Smyrna, but Jean Chadwick of Beaufort was high scorer for both teams with 16.

In the first quarter, Smyrna took a 10 point lead, 13-3, but by the end of the third quarter, the score was tied at 31 all. Each team had scored 6 points in the final period when Davis hit in the final seconds of the game to give the edge to Smyrna.
