The Blue Devils from Smyrna copped a two-overtime thriller at the Dixon court Friday night by a 62-60 margin. With the score tied at 60 all and time running out in the second overtime period, William Nelson dunked a field goal for the Blue Devils to give them the victory. The Smyrna girls won the opener, 45-41.

With Louis Thomas and Kenny Davis pacing the Blue Devil attack, Smyrna had a 15-point bulge at half time, 31-17. A strong second half by Dixon had the game tied at 54 all at the end of regulation time. The Dixon team out scored the Blue Devils by 12 points in the third period.

Thomas was high for the Blue Devils with 22 points. Davis had 16, and Nelson netted 10. Bill Smith was high man for Dixon with 32 points for the night.

In the girls game Serina Davis dropped 29 points through the hoops to spark the Smyrna attack. Elberta Gillikin netted 14, and Clarice Willis added 2 for 45 points. Betty Lewis scored 21 of the Dixon team's 41 points.

Smyrna built a 2-point edge in the first period, 13-11, and increased it to 4 points by the half. The teams played on even terms in the second half. Each team netted 9 points in the third period and 10 in the final period.
