The Smyrna Blue Devils dropped both ends of a doubleheader at Beaufort Tuesday night, with the Beaufort sextet taking the opener, 63-45, and the Seadogs winning the feature game, 50-51.

Nancy Mason dropped in 34 points for the winning sextet, while Serina Davis netted 20 for the losers. Elberta Gillikin hit for 18 points from outside, but her fine shooting wasn't enough to draw the Beaufort defenders far enough from the basket to let Davis and Jean Willis get loose under the backboards.

Jean Chadwick netted 18 points for the winners, and Frances Johnson added 11. Willis scored 7 for Smyrna.

Beaufort took an early lead which stood at 8-0 after four minutes of play. At the end of the first quarter they were ahead, 19-15. The Smyrna lassies pulled to within 2 points at the half, 31-29, but in the third quarter the Green and White of Beaufort pulled away by 15 points to lead, 50-33.

In the final period Beaufort added 13 points and held Smyrna to 12 for a final score of 63-45. The Beaufort guards, Rae Hassell, Winki Willis, and Judy Moore played a very good floor game, while the Smyrna guards put up a rather leaky defense at times. Beaufort scored 19 points in two quarters, the first and third.

Butch Hassell was the star in the Seadog victory in the second game. He was high scorer for the night with 22 points, but even more important, he played an outstanding floor game and kept the Blue Devils off balance all night with his shots from outside and his driving in for lay-ups when Smyrna guards came out to meet him.

Danny Willis netted 13 points for the Seadogs, demonstrating a good jump shot from 10 feet out.

Louis Thomas was high scorer for the Blue Devils with 15 points. He scored most of his points on lay-ups, but he hit a pair of two-hand set shots from 30 feet that never hit the rim. Kenny Davis hit for 14, and Ronnie Arthur got 8.

The first quarter of the game was very even with the lead going from team to team. The Seadogs were ahead by one basket at the end of the period, 14-12.

The Seadogs pulled away in the second quarter to lead by 10 at the half. The third quarter began with the Seadogs ahead, 32-22, and Smyrna cut the margin to 8 points in the period. The game speeded up in the final quarter with both teams hitting the basket for a total of 38 points. Beaufort hit for 20, and Smyrna got 18.
