Morehead Loses To Pawtucket

New England Class B. Team Knocks off Locals, 11-0, In Tidewater Game

Morehead City Tidewater team was shut out Sunday, 11-0 on six hits in a game played against Pawtucket of the New England Class B. League, now in training at New Bern.

Webb went all the way for the losers, allowing 11 hits and four earned runs, with two big innings accounting for most of Pawtucket tallies. Salter did the catching for Morehead.

A hit batter, a walk, and four hits in the fifth inning sewed up the ball game for Pawtucket, while the home team couldn't bunch enough of their hits together to make it count.

Although Webb allowed 11 hits, he pitched a pretty good ball game, striking out five. Errors made for the over-sized score. Jack Gardiner played a brilliant center field for Morehead, making some thrilling one-handed stabs to cut down Pawtucket, while Stoy, with two for four, looked good at the plate.

For Pawtucket, it was Anderson and Bennett doing the pitching and Shaw catching. Surma and Reardon had an option on Webb, with Surma getting a single, double, and a triple, and Reardon having a perfect day with three doubles and a single in four trips to the plate.

Pawtucket finished fourth in the New England League last year and has lost only one game in spring practice this season, dropping a close one to Tarboro.

Morehead City's next game will be Sunday at the Wade Memorial Field. The opponent has not yet been named.
