## Duke Stages Celebration Result Wins

Duke university students last night celebrated the close of the most successful year in athletics the Blue Devils have had in several years. The victory of the baseball team over Carolina closed the Duke season with a perfect record in state and southern conference ranks, and made a hero out of little "Lefty" Jenkins. Yesterday's victory placed double crown on Blue Devil brows, along with others gathered during the year.

While the Duke cross country and wrestling teams won state and southern titles during the fall and winter, yesterday's victory gave Duke her first conference championship in a major sport. The Duke players point to Coach Jack Coombs for much of the credit for their team's flawless conference record this season.

Making a great fight for the conference title in basketball during the Atlanta tournament, only to lose in the finals, the "baby" member of the conference came back to clinch a title in its first year of membership.

The game Thursday also closed a year of strong competition between Duke and Carolina. The Heels have taken three titles from Duke, and the Devils the same from Carolina, in events actually deciding championships.

For several hours last night the Duke campus bell rang incessantly, and students gathered in various parts of the campus to make merry. With the curtain rung down on athletics, however, they expect to immediately turn their attention to examinations and commencement.

## BULLS LOSE 4-1 AT SMITHFIELD
