

Hawks Show Championship Mettle in Win over Pamlico

The Pamlico jayvees handed the Newport junior varsity its third defeat in 14 games, 46-42; the Pamlico lassies took a 51-42 decision over the home team, and the visitors led for the first three quarters of the boys game. But the final score was in Newport's favor 59-53.

The Hawks were trailing, 47-45 going into the final period before they began to click. Gilbert Garner held the team together with his fine play during the first three quarters and ended the night with 19 points. During the Hawk rally in the final period, they scored 14 points and held Pamlico to 6, for a 59-53 victory.

Busk was high scorer for the game with 25 points, but he did not get enough support from his teammates in the final period to pull the game out of the fire.
