

Washington Pam Pack Defeats West Carteret Patriots 6-2

The Washington Pam Pack staked its pitcher to a four-run lead in the first inning and proceeded to post a 6-2 victory over the West Carteret Patriots Thursday afternoon. The Patriots traveled to Washington for their eighth straight loss.

The Pam Pack's four runs came on two doubles and three walks. They came right back in the second to score a single run on an error, a hit batsman and a single. Their final run came in the third on an error, a ground-out and a long sacrifice fly.

The Patriots scored one in the second inning when Chris Morrison reached first on an error by the Washington shortstop, Mickey Brown was hit by a pitched ball, and John Lee singled to score Chris. Their only other tally came in the sixth when Tom Dixon hit a single, Dewey Willis and Mike McBride walked (loading the bases) and Ray Murray walked to score Dixon.

John Lee was the losing pitcher although he was relieved in the second inning by Ray Salter. Lee walked three men and allowed

two hits. Salter struck out two and allowed three hits. He was relieved by Johnny Turnage who allowed one hit.

Phil Edwards, the winning pitcher, was relieved in the sixth by Woody Hardy. Together they struck out six, walked three and Edwards allowed three hits.

Langley and Don Gray were leading hitters for the Pam Pack with two hits in three at-bats. Dewey Willis and Lee were one for two and Tom Dixon was one for four.

Devils Defeat Jasper 7-1; Kenny Lewis Gets No-Hitter

The Blue Devils handed Jasper a 7-1 loss at Smyrna Friday. Kenny Lewis came away with a no-hitter in the contest.

The young pitcher struck out 13 and walked four, three in the second inning. The Jets managed their only run in the second inning on three walks and a Smyrna error.

The Devils picked up three runs in the first inning. McGee reached first on one of six Jasper errors. Charles Lawrence singled. Kenny Lewis got on on an error, loading the bases.

A single by Terry Lewis, and a throwing error, allowed three base runners to score.

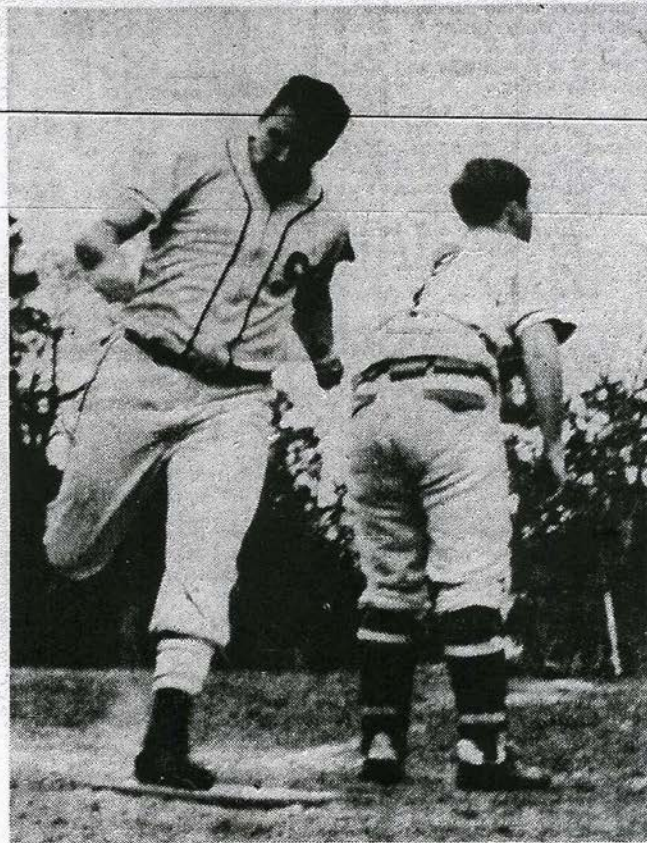
Jim Bradford singled to open the third inning. McGee singled, sending Bradford to third, then stole second. A single by Charles Lawrence scored Bradford and McGee.
