

Bulldogs Rap Eagles 8-2 on 13 Walks

In a baseball game played Friday afternoon on the Morehead City diamond, the Morehead City Eagles out-hit Wallace-Rose Hill high school, of Wallace, 7-6 but pitchers Jim Lawrence and Jim Turner gave up a total of 13 walks to give Wallace an 8-2 victory.

The game was fairly close for five innings as the two teams went into the fifth with the score all even at 2-2. Wallace scored two runs in the inning to make the score 4-2 and they were never headed after that.

Coach Norman Clark relieved lefthander Lawrence with righthander Jim Turner in the sixth inning and Turner went the rest of the way for the Eagles. Lawrence picked up the loss while the winning pitcher was Bunch of Wallace-Rose Hill. Moore relieved Bunch in the sixth inning.

Walter Morris of Morehead City led the Eagles at the plate as he collected two hits.

The win left the Bulldogs still undefeated in Coastal Plain conference play while the Eagles' league record now stands at one win and one loss.
