

## Seadogs Lead Final Ratings

The Beaufort Seadogs, 20-0 winners over Andrews for the Class A title of the state, were selected as the top eleven in the state in the final poll of the Greensboro Daily News' schoolboy ratings.

This marked the first time this season that Beaufort had been rated in the top spot in the poll, their previous high being their No. 3 ranking that was released prior to the Andrews game. In that poll Andrews was rated No. 1.

The championship loss to the Seadogs dropped the Wildcats all the way down to fourth in the final poll with their record of 10 wins and four losses.

Norlina, losers for the Eastern Class A championship to Beaufort was voted the No. 2 spot.

## Nelson's 31 Points Paces 84-39 Rout of Devil Pups

The Smyrna Blue Devils swept a doubleheader from the Camp Lejeune Devil Pups Friday night, the boys winning the feature game 84-39 after the girls had won over Camp Lejeune 53-44 in the opener.

A change in the Blue Devil defense in the last half allowed Smyrna to turn the game into a rout as they held the Devil Pups to a total of only 16 points in the last two quarters. Camp Lejeune had been able to play the Blue Devils pretty close for the first eight minutes, trailing at the end of the initial period by only one point at 18-17.

In the second period Smyrna poured a scorching 23 points through the hoop for a halftime advantage of 18 points at 41-23. They continued their onslaught on the basket in the last half to com-

pletely run away from the Devil Pups to the final 45-point victory margin. Camp Lejeune could manage only seven points in the third quarter and only nine in the final period.

Floor general Curt Nelson turned in the highest scoring performance of a county player this year by burning the nets for 31 points to spark the win. The slick ball handler had 12 field goals and seven free throws for the total.

Sophomore Dale Lewis, who has regained his scoring stride after being held to 10 points by Swansboro, finished second to Nelson with a total of 21 points. Also finishing in double figures was Braxton Finner who threw in 16 points. The highest total for a Devil Pup player was the 17 points scored by Chapman.

The Blue Devils compiled a shooting average of 78.8 per cent from the charity stripe hitting on
