# Blue Devils Bomb Monarchs Bow Pirate Five 109-65 56-39 in Opener

With Curt Nelson dropping in 33 points and Braxton Piner adding 30, the Smyrna Blue Devils came up with the top county offensive showing of the year Finday night as they buried the Atlantic Pirates 109-65.

A blazing third quarter, in which the Blue Devils burned the nets for 36 points, enabled Smyrna to go over the 100-point mark to register their top point total of the year. Nelson was almost the whole show in the third quarter as he sank nine straight field goal attempts in the period.

The Pirates managed to stay pretty close to the Blue Devils in the first quarter as they trailed by only five points, at 24-19, at the end of the period.

In the second quarter, however, the roof fell in on the Pivates as Smyrna fashioned a 19-point lead by outscoring the Atlantic quint 20-6. Then came the fatal third quarter which all but put the game on ice for the Blue Devils.

Smyrna coach Jim Parkin used his second unit throughout most of the last quarter and the second stringers outscored the Pirates 27-

Behind Nelson and Piner in scoring for the Blue Devils came James Meares and Vaughn Yeomans with 15 and 12 points respectively. Danny Harvey paced the Atlantic attack with 29 points while Ray Tallant contributed 14.

The Smyrna girls stayed undefeated in the opener as they downed Atlantic 63-38 for their seventh straight win. Carollyn Phelps, with 36 points, and Brenda Golden, with 23, paced the Smyrna scoring attack that scored 45 points in the last half after being held to only 18 in the first two frames.

All of the Atlantic scoring was done by Bonnie Brickhouse and Annis Willis with Brickhouse scoring 30 points and Annis getting

the other eight.

Guards for the two teams were Linda Willis, Alice Chadwick, Trudy Gillikin, Elizabeth Styron, and Diane Willis for Smyrna and Jencey Mason, Annette Robinson, Jean Bell, Margie Webb, Ellen Salter, and Barbara Styron for Atlantic.
