

# Pair Get Victories In Semipro Event

## Albemarle And Durham Bees Beat Highfalls And Cedar Falls In Play

ASHEBORO, July 26.—Albemarle and Durham Bees, both coming through with one-sided victories, eliminated Highfalls and Cedar Falls, respectively, with victories in the afternoon schedule of the state semipro tournament here today.

Both contests were halted after seven innings of play by the tournament rule which permits calling of a game after that time if one team has an eight-run lead.

Albemarle, paced by the hitting of Buck Foglia and Billy Evans, took an 8-0 shutout triumph from the Highfalls nine. Hoyle Talbert scattered five hits well over the route.

Durham turned on the hitting power to sweep aside Cedar Falls 12 to 4.

Albemarle had two big innings, the fifth and sixth, in which three runs counted each time. After Lamar Dorton had singled to drive in Hoyle Talbert, Evans lifted a hit to center field which was misjudged and went for a homer in

the fifth. In the sixth, Foglia singled to drive in Crawford Talbert and Dorton. Hoyle Talbert scored on an infield out.

Durham had a big five-run fifth with Nifong's triple combining with singles by Folger, Gurganus, Krape and Poe. Nifong drove in two more with a double in the next inning.

Cedar Falls counted three times in the fifth on an error, a fielder's choice, a single by Lester Bullins and a double by Dick Strider which cleared the packed bases.

Two contests are on schedule Monday night. At 6:30 p. m., Robbins will play the loser of the Lucas-High Point game tonight. At 8:30 Siler City will meet Albemarle.

# MAJORS SECURE FIVE; TWO WILL PLAY IN MINORS

## Yankees Take Werber—Farley Leaves To Join Cardinals Kistler And Jenkins Become Mackmen — Orioles Get Warren

Major and minor league scouts, who have trailed the Duke university baseball team ever since Jack Coombs, former big time star, took over the coaching reins, reaped the fruit of their efforts here Saturday night and yesterday, signing seven of the finishing Blue Devils for professional ball.

The men signed, their positions, and their home towns are: Bill Werber, shortstop, Berwyn, Md., New York Yankees; Roland Farley, third baseman, Danville, Va., St. Louis Cardinals; Henry Kistler, Charlotte, and Ernest Jenkins, Gastonia, Philadelphia Athletics; Gene Belue, Gaffney, S. C., Pittsburgh Pirates; L. A. "Nick" Warren, Durham, Baltimore Orioles; and Lee Hawkins, Charlotte, Charlotte, (Sally league).

**Yanks Get Werber**  
Bill Werber, sensational shortstop for the Devils, was probably the most sought after man on the team. Coming from a baseball family with a father and a brother before him who played professional ball, Werber signed a contract with the Yankees that any college ball player could be proud of. It is said that the young Duke star got a huge bonus as well as a profitable salary.

**Hawkins To Bees**  
Lee Hawkins, hard-hitting pitcher-outfielder, lives in Charlotte and had been assured the contract some time ago. His work on the pitching staff was a help to the Devils this year, as his list of victories by far outnumbered the number of defeats counted against him. He is a left-hander.
