## Blast Hill From Hill

Morehead clinched the game from the start, pacing across 8 runs as they pasted W. S. Hill off the mound. Big noise in the batting attack was center fielder Jack Gardner, who got 3 for 5. Saddler boomed a triple for Morehead, while Webb, Stillway, and Gardner also connected for extra bases.

In Sunday's game, played at Newport, the home team had Morehead plumb worried when they got hot in the eighth, tieing up the ball game at 5-5. Webb held them to no further damage by striking out four of the last five batters, after Styron had come on in the eighth for Wade.

Five Straight Walks

Five successive walks and one hit enabled Newport to climb from behind, but it proved too little, too late.

Morehead's biggest inning was the sixth when they scored three runs. They sewed up the ball game in the ninth when Stillway and Stoy clipped singles, scoring Styron, who had walked.

Aycock, pitching for Newport, allowed 6 hits, struck out 7, and walked 5. Wade allowed 4 hits in the 7 innings he worked, striking out 7 and walking 7. Styron walked 1 and gave up 1 in the 1/3 of an inning he pitched.
