Hawks Lose Twin Bill To Swansboro Pirates

The Newport Hawks traveled to Swansboro Saturday night and dropped both ends of a doubleheader to the Pirates. The Swansboro lassies doubled the score on Newport in taking a 32-16 victory in the first game.

In the feature game the teams battled on even terms except for a third quarter rally by the Pirates that gave them a 59-48 victory. The Hawks, sparked by the sharp-shooting Larry Wallace, moved into a 12-11 lead in the first quarter.

At the end of the first half the Hawks still had their one-point margin with the score 27-26. The Pirates surged ahead in the third quarter on the strength of a 21-point scoring spree.

They held the Hawks to nine points while they were hitting for 21. That spelled the difference in the ball game. Each team scored 12 points in the final quarter.

Dallas Darnell was high scorer for the winners with 23 points. Wallace was high for Newport with 21 markers. Paul Kozma looked good for the Pirates as he hit for 19 points.

Scoring for Newport were Wallace, 21, Larry Kirk, 10, Johnny Mason, 8, Johnny Turpin, 2, Reuben Lilly, 3, and Billy Wade, 4. Alton Hardison did not score.

Scoring for Swansboro were Darnell, 23, Kozma, 19, Guthrie, 1, Lisk, 3, Littleton, 4, Metts, 2, and Smith, 7.

The Beaufort Seadogs laid it on the Smyrna Blue Devils by a 95-42 margin Friday night at Beaufort. Beaufort Coach T. H. McQuaid cleared his bench in an effort to hold the score down, but the reserves caught fire and continued to run the score up.

All 11 players on the Seadog roster broke into the scoring column. Figures ranged from Butch Hassell's high of 26 points to two points scored by Kit Jones.

Beaufort's starting five played about half of the ball game and scored 66 points. Danny Willis, 10, and Sammy Merrill, 7, started at forwards, Allen Autrey, 4, started at center, and Butch Hassell, 26, and Raymond Gillikin, 19, started at guards.

Reserves See Action

This combination played most of the first and third quarters of the game with one or two substitutions. Most of the rest of the game was played by reserves.

At the end of the first quarter the Seadogs were enjoying a 28-2 lead. Coach McQuaid had broken his starting combination, leaving Butch Hassell in with Kit Jones, Calvin Jones, Pud Hassell, Bobby Willis and Alex Copeland.

These players started the second quarter and ran the score to 56-12 by the half. Larry Dudley and Danny Willis played about half of the second quarter, replacing Butch Hassell and Kit Jones.

Smyrna coach H. T. Sanders countered with a junior, two sophomores and two freshmen. He left his high scorer, Glenn Willis, on the bench through the first half.

Piner Leads Losers

Willis scored six points during the second half but did not look impressive against the Beaufort defense. Braxton Piner was high scorer for the losers with 14 points. Other Smyrna players who scored were Woody Hancock, 1, Lambert Davis, 6, Paul Wade, 9, Vaughn Yeomans, 1, James Mears, 1, and Curtis Nelson, 4.

Scoring totals for the Beaufort substitutes follow: Larry Dudley, 6, Calvin Jones, 8, Alex Copeland, 4, Bobby Willis, 4, Pud Hassell, 5, and Kit Jones, 2.

Copeland, who started last year, has seen only limited service this season. He is nursing a sore foot that he injured playing football.
