

## Edged, Morehead City Wins

### • Big 5th Inning Wins for MCHS

Morehead City Eagles played host to Pamlico Tuesday afternoon and came from behind, scoring five runs in the bottom of the fifth inning to edge past the Hurricanes 6-5.

Pamlico started out as if they meant business by scoring four runs in the top of the first inning. They then held the Eagles scoreless until the bottom of the third when Morehead chalked up their first tally.

Pamlico scored one more in their half of the fourth. In the top of the fifth, the Eagles tied up the game and then went ahead by crossing the plate five times before the Hurricanes could retire the side.

The victim of the Eagle uprising was Pamlico's righthander Potter who went the distance and was tagged for the loss.

Coach Norman Clark of the Eagles started with a righthander also, in the person of Jimmie Lawrence. Lawrence worked the entire seven innings and was tagged for seven hits and chalked up five strikeouts. Morehead got to Potter for a total of nine hits, including two doubles.

Pacing the hitting parade for the Eagles were leftfielder Linwood Durham and second baseman Walter Morris. Each had two hits in four times at the plate and each slammed out a double.

By virtue of the victory the Eagles are now in sole possession of second place in the league with a record of 2 wins and two losses. For the season, they are still slightly below the .500 mark with a record of four wins and five defeats.

Next action for Morehead City will be this afternoon when they travel to Wallace to take on Wallace-Rose Hill high school.
