

Smyrna Blue Devils Post 55-38 Win Over Newport

Hawkettes Lose 88-86

Thriller in Opener

The Smyrna Blue Devils won their third straight game Tuesday night and Newport Hawks lost their fourth straight as Smyrna recorded a 55-38 win in a game played in Newport between the two teams.

With Dale Lewis back in the Smyrna lineup and able to go full speed after injuring an ankle a month ago, the Blue Devils led throughout the game. Lewis topped all scorers for the game by dumping in five field goals and nine free throws for a total of 19 points.

Although the Blue Devils were off from their usual 70-point plus scoring game, they still managed to maintain comfortable leads over the Hawks. The end of the first quarter found the Blue Devils enjoying a five-point spread at 13-8 and by halftime they had upped this to 14 points as they left the floor with a 30-16 advantage.

Smyrna took its largest lead of the night in the third quarter as they outscored Newport 15-12 to take a 17-point edge.

Hawk co-captain Winkie Chadwick again took scoring honors for his team with a 13-point performance. Donnie Aycock was next in line with a pair of field goals and two free throws for six points. Braxton Piner and Curt Nelson trailed Lewis in the Smyrna scoring with 12 and 11 points respectively.

Free throw statistics on the game showed that the Blue Devils hit 65.6 of their gift shots, making 21 of 32. Newport sank six of their 14 free throws for a 42.8 per cent mark.

The Smyrna and Newport girls hooked up in a real duel in the preliminary game with Smyrna coming out on top 88-86 to maintain their unbeaten string for the year. The girl Blue Devils have now won all eight of the games they have played.

Towering Carolyn Phelps was the game's high scorer with 51 points while her team mate Brenda Golden and Newport's Jenny Lynn Garner each tallied 35. Newport's All-County Margaret Lilly chipped in with 29 points for the Hawkettes and Bette Green added 22. Rose Arthur scored two points for Smyrna.

Smyrna used only four guards in the game employing Linda Willis, Elizabeth Styron, Alice Chadwick and Becky Brown in the back court. Newport guards included Lana Linebarger, Paula Mann, Dottie Whitley, Jane Murdock and Betsy Oglesby.
