COLLINS, Fox, Waldroff and Willis shared the hitting honors. Richard went 3 for 4 and scored 2 runs, Alex hit safely twice in 4 appearances and batted in 2 runs, Waldroff had 1 for 3 and scored 2 runs and Willis went 2 for 5, with a double that contributed 1 RBI.

Waldroff pitched 4-hit ball in his 6 and two-third innings. He tore some ligaments in his right hurling arm and took himself out of the game with the bases loaded in the seventh. That's when Vinston stepped in to retire Willis and finish out the contest with 2-hit shutout ball.

THE SOX touched George Zurenko and Brad Piner for 10 hits. They scored all their runs off Zurenko in his 5 innings. Piner blanked the Newport power with 3 hits in his 4 innings, during which he struck out 6.

Fielding gems abounded. Allen Garner roomed all over the diamond to handle 7 difficult chances with errorless aplomb. Vinston started in left field and
