Ray started and coached a midget team when Ray Hassell, Jr. and I were in 6th - 7th grades, that we played in and won tournaments against teams in Carteret and Onslow Counties, including a couple of Lejeune's teams.

Bob Rose - big Supporter and help to Mcquaid 1955

Bob Rose, who lived in the area at the time (1955) (had a Ford dealership in Havelock- "Robert L. Rose for the car that goes!"), was married at the time to our neighbor and friend Betty Lou Merrill of Beaufort. Bob was a native of Smithfield, was Captain of UNC basketball teams in late 40's or early 50's and was All-Southern Conference at least once. He sort of "adopted" the 1955 team and helped Coach McQuaid some. Everyone remembers that Bob outfitted the entire team with new Converse All-Stars before they left for the State Tournament in Greensboro in '55.

Beaufort's 1954 team won the District and went to the State Tournament in Aberdeen, losing but winning the consolation game. My sister was in the class of '55 with Gehrmann Holland, Murray "Monk" Pittman, Henry Safrit and Herb Mason, all seniors on that team.
