

Blue Devils Bow Tuesday Night to Seadogs

Beaufort Seadogs handed the Smyrna Blue Devils a whopping 61-49 defeat Tuesday night on the Seadog court. This was the second Blue Devil loss to the Seadogs this season. In December the score was 76-53 in favor of Beaufort.

Smyrna started the game with a bang, scoring 18 points in the first quarter while holding Beaufort to 10. The second quarter saw the Seadogs narrow the margin to three points by scoring 17 points. The Blue Devils could only wrangle 12 in the second quarter, but they still held a 30-27 lead at halftime.

The halftime rest seemed to be just what the Seadogs needed, for they drew ahead of Smyrna in the third quarter and maintained their lead during the remainder of the game. The third period saw Beaufort rack up 18 points while Smyrna put away 10. In the final frame the Seadogs added 16 points to their total, but the 9 points tallied by the Blue Devils were not enough to keep them in the game.

It was Way all the way for the Seadogs. Brady Way scored 24 points, more than twice as many as anyone else on his team. Johnny Hassell was second in scoring with 9 points.

High man for Smyrna was Joe Willis, who poured 12 points through the hoop. Norris Nelson was a close second with 11 points.
