

# Trio Clubs Lead Way In State All-Star Choice

McCrary, Hanes Hosiery and May Hosiery Land Three Players Each On Tournament Aggregation—Hunter and Groome Are Honored By Selections.

The first North Carolina semi-pro baseball tournament has been completed and the class of the ball players of that rating has performed before the spectators out at Memorial stadium for the last 15 days.

As in any other such event, an all-star team must be selected, and the committee responsible for choosing the players has to announce the choice.

Only one flaw can be found with the selection of the team. By a ruling by the National semi-pro baseball congress, any player who has had previous professional baseball connections is ineligible to make the team.

This rule prevented the committee composed of Hoyt T. Hambricht, state semi-pro baseball commissioner; Laurence Leonard, Daily News sports editor, and the four umpires who served during the tourney, Tom Truelove, umpire-in-chief; Coley Loman, Joby Hawn and Lyman Adams, from placing certain players who they felt deserved a position on the club.

Three clubs furnished the majority of the 16 performers who were chosen, McCrary, Hanes Hosiery and May Hosiery, with three men each, had the majority. Lucky Strike landed two, and Hanes Knitters, Ca-Vel, Proximity, Statesville and McEwen one each.

Each player chosen will receive a certificate of merit from the National congress signed by Hans Wagner.
