

Saltwater Loop Plans Season

With six teams represented, the Saltwater league held its first meeting of the season Wednesday night in Beaufort. Four of last year's five teams were represented at the meeting and two new teams also requested admission to the loop.

The four old teams were Beaufort, Salter Path, Harkers Island and Mill Creek-Newport. Atlantic, which completed the loop last year, did not have a representative at the meeting but is expected to field a team again this season.

Morehead City has requested admission to the league, and a Marine group from Wildwood has also expressed a desire to play. Action on the requests will be taken at a future meeting.

Ray Cummins was asked to make copies of the by-laws of the Saltwater league and also of those of the old Tidewater loop. The by-laws will be studied and revised at the next meeting which will be held at 7:30 Thursday night at the radio station.

Dick Lockey of Newport has been asked to draw up a tentative schedule which will be presented for discussion at Thursday's meeting. The members hope to be able to begin play in mid-April.

Jimmy Rabon of Morehead City has been asked to organize a staff of umpires for the league season. Lockey and Ralph Eudy of Beaufort have been asked to serve as advisers for the loop.
