"The book has drawn so much unfavorable criticism from read-ers of advance copies that one high Brooklyn official commented: 'This thing could be Leo's exit ticket.'

The book, ghosted by Dodger The book, ghosted by Dodger traveling secretary Harold Parrott, refers to beanballs and dusters. There are a number of lines about Dodgers gambling at racetracks and about playing cards for heavy stakes.
