Beaufort Tops Salter Path, Holds County League Lead

Beaufort won two games from Salter Path Sunday afternoon to hold its position at the top of the Carteret county baseball league. Beaufort won the first game 9-4 and took the second game 11-6.

Clyde Owens received credit for both wins. He started and finished the first game and took over in the fourth inning of the nightcap. Jimmy Piner was the loser in the first game and Walter Thomas was the loser in the second.

Salter Path outhit Beaufort 9-7 in both games but could not get enough runs to make up the difference. Owens struck out 12 in the first game and Piner struck out seven.

Sammy Daniels was the leading batter for Beaufort in the first game with three hits in four trips to the plate.

Harkers Island moved into third place in the league behind Atlantic by virtue of two wins over Morehead City. The islanders beat Morehead City 4-0 in the first game and won the second 12-8.

Billy Neal was the winning pitcher in the first game and Bobby Bass was charged with the loss. Neal struck out ten of the Morehead City batters and gave up three hits. The winners got four hits off Bass who struck out four.

Harkers Island got one run in the fourth on a series of errors by Morehead City. They got three more runs in the sixth on two bases on balls and doubles by Creston Gaskill, Norman Chadwick and C. Hamilton.

Harkers Island got ten hits in the second game, and Morehead City got eight. Ralph Lawrence was the winning pitcher and Jimmy Webb was the loser.

Atlantic took two games from Mill Creek-Newport, but details of the game have not yet been reported.
