Beaufort Takes Twin Bill From Harkers Island Nine

Beaufort continues to hold the top spot in the county league standings as the result of a double win Sunday over Harkers Island. Beaufort won the first game 8-1 and won the second 14-4.

Clyde Owens pitched one-hit ball to give Beaufort its win in the first game. The lone hit off him was a single by C. Gaskill. The victory leaves Owens the league's top pitcher with a record of six wins and one loss. Wilson Davis was charged with the loss.

Davis gave up seven hits over the seven-inning game. Lewis Woodard was the top hitter for Beaufort with three singles in three trips to the plate. Owens helped his own cause along with a triple.

Calvin Hodges won his third straight victory in the second game, and C. Lewis was charged with the loss. Hodges gave up seven hits, and his mates collected 13 off the Harkers Island pitchers.

Jimmie Fodrie led the Beaufort offense with three hits, two singles and a home run. Other leading batters were Hodges and Carl Sadler, each with three hits in three times at bat.

Atlantic remains in second place in the league, one game off the pace. Atlantic took two from Salter Path Sunday, winning the first game 2-0 and the second 10-8.

Roy McKamey was the winning pitcher in the first game, and Walter Thomas was charged with the loss. McKamey gave up four hits, and his mates got four off the hurling of Thomas and P. Jones who relieved him.

Geroock was the winning pitcher in the second game, and J. Piner was the loser. Atlantic got 16 hits, and Salter Path got 12.

Leading batters for Atlantic were J. Hamilton with three for four and R. Smith with four for five. John Willis and Geroock each doubled for Atlantic, and Hamilton got a triple.

P. Jones and Herbert Holloman led the Salter Path attack, each with three hits in four times at bat. Each got two doubles during the game.

In the other league double-header, Morehead City took both games from Mill Creek-Newport. Morehead City won the first game 6-5 and won the second 8-2.

Chuck Hall started on the mound for Morehead City in the first game and was relieved by Jimmy Webb in the fourth. Webb got credit for the win and McClannon was charged with the loss.

Morehead City won the game in the last half of the seventh inning. Behind 5-4, Morehead City tied the score when a runner scored from second on Charles Freeman's single through the middle of the infield. The centerfielder then threw the ball into the stands, allowing the man on first to go to third from where he later scored.

Bobby Bass went all the way in the second game to get credit for the win. Frank Cahoon started for Newport and was relieved by Myers in the first inning. Cahoon was charged with the loss.

Ray Cummins was the leader in the Morehead City offense with five hits in seven trips. He got two for three in the first game and three for four in the second. His hits included two singles, a double, a triple and a home run.

Billy Willis, a newcomer to the Morehead City team, got two for two in the first game and two for four in the second.
