# Two Teams List Choices For County All-Star Tilt

With the county league all-star game a week away, two of the six teams in the league, Morehead City and Harkers Island, have already selected their representatives on the teams. The remaining teams in the league are expected to announce their players within the next few days.

Harkers Island's five players will be Creston Gaskill, catcher; Billy Neal, shortstop; Jerry Guthrie, center field; Cranston Moore, third base; and Ralph Lawrence, pitcher.

Morehead City's representatives will be Bobby Willis, catcher and infielder; Lou Prince, catcher; Charles Freeman, right field; Bobby Bass, pitcher and shortstop; and Jimmy Willis, center field. Morehead City also chose two alternates, Ray Cummins, first base, and Norman Larkee, second base and shortstop.

Each team in the league is allowed five players on the all-star squads. One squad will represent the three eastern teams and one will represent the three western teams.

The manager of the top team in each division will manage his division's all-star team. The game will be played Sunday, July 5, in Wade Brothers stadium, Morehead City.

In this Sunday's games, Beaufort will be out to increase its league lead at the expense of Newport which is still in last place in the league standings.

Second-place Atlantic will play host to Morehead City which is

tied with Salter Path for third place in the league standings. The game promises to be a slugfest with both teams having several power hitters in their lineups.

Salter Path will be at Smyrna for two games with fifth-place Harkers Island.
