

# Charles Hassell Leaves Statistician Job; Charles Jarman, Beaufort, Replaces Him

President Ralph Eudy of the Tidewater League has just appointed Charles Jarman of Beaufort as official league statistician.

The resignation of Charles Hassell of Beaufort, Tidewater League statistician, was accepted at a special meeting of the league Thursday night in Morehead City municipal building.

The league agreed to a plan to obtain a new statistician who will be paid \$8 a week for the work, \$1 a week from each team. This plan was adopted in view of the heavy amount of work involved with the statistician's job. Mr. Hassell was appointed to find someone who would accept the position.

An agreement was entered into between the league and Tex Mitchell of Cherry Point whereby Mitchell will be chief umpire and receive \$80 per season. He agrees to be responsible for umpires being present at all games and agrees to rotate the umpires between different teams. He will also hold umpires' meetings at least once a month to clear up questions about rules and to acquaint umpires with any new regulations or procedures.

The \$80 paid to Mr. Mitchell will be in addition to the \$7.50 per game he will receive for umpiring. This \$80 is to cover telephone calls, stationery, stamps, and any other incidentals.

It was agreed that all Saturday games shall be played at 3 o'clock and all Sunday games at 2:30 p. m. Admission shall be 25 cents for children and 50 cents for adults. Any persons found in the dugouts not wearing a uniform will be fined \$5.

New umpires signed up for this year's play are T. E. Mitchell, Richard May, Carl Hatsell, Grant Privette, Jimmy Rabon, Robert Moulthrop, George Carter and Harry Fisher.

The meeting of the league called for 8 o'clock tonight will not be held since the special meeting cleared up all impending business.

## Beaufort Loses Both Openers, Morehead Wins

### Beaufort Loses to Newport, 8-5, 3-0; Morehead Beats Marshallberg Twice

Play in Tidewater League baseball games got off to a big bang last weekend with all teams participating. Morehead City and Beaufort, who will meet for two games this weekend, found themselves at the opposite ends of a two game streak.

Morehead City opened up with a 13-5 decision over Marshallberg Saturday. James Webb was the winning pitcher. Sunday the Morehead City team again whipped Marshallberg, this time for a 16-4 score. John Rafferty and Odell Morton were the winning pitchers and Carlton Green, Raymond Roberson and Haywood Kelly were the heavy hitters for the winners. Bill McKinney was the catcher for Morehead City in both games.

Beaufort, on the other hand, received two defeats by a three-run margin while Morehead City was polishing its victor's crown. Newport was the winning team both times. On Saturday Newport beat Beaufort 8-5 and on Sunday they repeated with a 3-0 decision. Fred Taylor was Newport's big gun in the pitching box Sunday when he hurled a one-hitter.

Joe Hill was the pitcher credited with Saturday's victory but only after he was ordered to leave the field. During the course of the game, a Beaufort player was called safe at third base by Umpire Tex Mitchell. Hill and other players disputed Mitchell's decision and finally Mitchell ordered Hill off the field. Newport's winning pitcher departed but it was too late for Beaufort to repair the damage. They lost, 8-5.

Wade Bell, business manager of the Morehead City team, says that his team is going easy on Beaufort this weekend and not beat them as hardy as they beat Marshallberg. It should be an interesting game.
