

Seadogs Win 7-3 Con With Blue Devils in 8t

The Blue Devils came from behind in the sixth Tuesday to tie Beaufort and force an extra inning, but couldn't stop a Seadog rally in the eighth. Beaufort won the contest, at Smyrna, 7-3.

The visitors got one run in the fourth inning. Paul Biermann reached first on an error by the Devils' third baseman, and went to second on a fielder's choice. He moved to third on a single from Bill Temple and scored on an error, an infield grounder by Mickey Bertram.

The Seadogs added another in the fifth. Mack McIntosh hit by the second baseman to reach first, stole second and came home on Tony Smith's double.

The club built its lead to three in the top of the sixth. Thompson Lewis opened with a double, advanced to third on a fielder's choice and scored on a single by Bertram.

But the Blue Devils matched Beaufort's three-inning effort in the bottom of the sixth. Danny Lawrence led off with a single. Jim Brafford singled, and both men moved up on a passed ball.

Lawrence came home on a wild pitch, while Brafford took third. Brafford scored on an error by the Seadogs' third baseman, a hit by Tommy McGee, who took second on the play. McGee went to third on another passed ball, then came in on a wild pitch.

Biermann began Beaufort's eighth-inning rally with a single. He went to third on a double by Lewis, his second of the day. Both runners scored on a double by Bill Temple, and Temple took third on a throwing error.

He scored on Bertram's double, with Bertram moving to third on an error by Smyrna's center fielder. Micky came home on a passed ball, the seventh run.

Smyrna threatened in the bottom of the eighth, but couldn't score. McGee singled, and went to third on a double by Ted Lewis. They got no farther.

John Way went the full eight innings to collect the win, his fourth. The Seadogs are 4-5 to date. Way fanned 16 batters, walked two and gave up six hits.

Kenny Lewis relieved Keith Piner after seven innings, and wound up with the loss. Together, they struck out 12, walked one and allowed nine hits.

The Devils left five men stranded in the game. Beaufort left six. The visitors committed one error, against four for Smyrna.
