

Morehead Tops Smyrna

The Morehead City Eagles picked up four runs on two hits and several miscues to top Smyrna 4-1 Friday afternoon. Smyrna reached pitcher Bobby Bass for four hits but could produce only one run.

The Eagles' two hits came in the first inning and produced one run. Norman Larkee, leadoff man in the inning, singled, stole second and scored on a sacrifice by Hewitt. Hewitt was thrown out while attempting to steal second, and Bobby Willis struck out to end the inning.

The run brought the Eagles even with Smyrna who had scored in the first half of the inning. Alton Paul, second man up, reached first on an error, went to second when Osborne Davis grounded out and scored on Bruce Babbitt's single. The inning ended when Roy Styron struck out.

The Eagles took the lead in the third. Leadoff man Jimmy Willis walked and went to second when Kemp Wickizer was hit by pitcher Styron. Willis went to third on Larkee's sacrifice and scored when Gil Faber grounded out. Wickizer reached third but was left stranded when Hewitt popped up.

Smyrna threatened in the fourth but could not score. The visitors came up with singles by Davis and Jackie Page, but Davis was caught trying to stretch the hit into a double and strikeouts ended the threat.

The Eagles added another run in the fourth. Bobby Willis reached first when he was struck by a pitched ball and went to second on a wild pitch. He went to third when Bass reached first on an error and scored when Bass went to second on another miscue.

Morehead City added its final run in the fifth on two free passes and an error. Larkee walked, went to second when Faber walked and later scored on an error.

Smyrna picked up another hit in the seventh but could not score. Page singled and went to second when Gillikin flied out. He was left on second, however, when Dixon grounded out to end the game.

The visitors' Roy Styron turned in a slightly better pitching performance than Bass but several periods of wildness cost him the victory. Styron gave up only two hits against the four given up by Bass, but he walked three while Bass issued no free passes. Both hurlers were even in strikeouts with eight each. A wild pitch and two hit batters proved to be Styron's downfall.

The Eagles will be seeking their fourth win of the season today when they meet Dixon at Dixon. The Eagles now have a record of three wins and one loss. The one defeat came at the hands of Jones Central.
