With the first annual all-star place with five wins and nine losgame written into the record books, the six Carteret county league teams will again turn their attention to the completion of their reg-/ular season.

With only three weeks left in the season the teams will be fighting for the four playoff spots. The two teams at the bottom of the standings at the end of the season will be eliminated from the postseason playoffs.

Atlantic and Beaufort, tied for first place in the standings with identical records of 11 wins and two losses, seem to be assured of playoff spots. The other four teams are battling for the remaining spots with any one of the four having an excellent chance to make the playoffs.

At present Salter Path is in the runner-up spot, 51/2 games back of the leaders. Salter Path has a record of six wins and eight losses. Only 21/2 games separate Salter Path and last-place Newport which has a record of three wins and ten
