# Beaufort Tops Morehead, Holds County League Lead

Beaufort remained on top in the county league standings by virtue of a double win over Morehead City Sunday. Beaufort won the first game 8-4 and the second 5-2.

Clyde Owens pitched a six-hitter for Beaufort to rack up his ninth win of the season against one defeat. Jimmy Webb was the losing pitcher. After giving up five hits and seven runs in the first inning, Webb settled down and gave up six hits and one run over the remaining innings.

Louis Woodard was the leading batter for Beaufort with three singles in three trips to the plate. Extra-base hits were a home run by Carl Sadler and a double by Dick Smith. Butler, with two for three, was the top hitter for Morehead City.

In the second game, Calvin Hodges hurled three-hit ball to notch his fourth win of the season without a defeat. The only extra-base hit off him was a double by Bobby Bass, the losing pitcher.

Bass gave up only six hits, but four of them in the fifth inning accounted for all five Beaufort runs. The runs came on two doubles, two singles and a hit batter. The two doubles were by Woodard and Jim Hawkins.

Hodges was the leading batter for Beaufort with two singles in two times at bat.

The double win leaves Beaufort with a half-game lead over second place Atlantic which swamped Harkers Island in a doubleheader. Atlantic scored a total of 33 runs in the two games, winning the first 20-1 and the second 13-2.

Roy McKamey started both games for Atlantic and received credit for both wins. He left after his team had scored all of its 13 runs in the first five innings of the second game.

Moe Willis was charged with the loss in the first game, and Wilson Davis was the loser in the second.

In other county league games Sunday, Newport and Salter Path split. Newport won the first game 8-2 and Salter Path won the second game 10-3.

J. W. McClannon was the winning pitcher and Walter Thomas was charged with the loss in the first game. McClannon gave up five hits and struck out nine, and Thomas gave up eight hits and struck out eight.

Extra-base hits for Salter Path were a double by Powell and a triple by Jones. Culpepper got a double for Newport.

Jimmy Piner was the winner in the second game, and Joe Hill was the loser. Piner gave up four hits, and Salter Path got 11 off four Newport hurlers.

Extra-base hits for Salter Path were doubles by Parkins, Piner and Jones.

Sunday's games did nothing to ease the tension of the battle for the two remaining playoff spots. Beaufort and Atlantic are assured of making the playoffs, but the

other four teams are scrambling for the other places.
