So now the Tides stand all-square at 500 with 2 victories and 2 defeats and the Sox hold an embarrassing 1-3 record. Meanwhile, the potentially great Salter Path Braves blir and fail to comprehend how they have managed to lose all 4 of their starts, each and every one a might-have-been triumph.

BOTH WINNERS YESTERDAY raced from behind and overcame what appeared to be insurmountable leads.

Manager Donnie Aycock's Red Sox jumped on Grays' starting pitcher Delbert Sutton for 4 runs in the first on Craig Weber's crashing double, Ronald Greene's single, a walk to Allen Garner, George Viereck's neatly stroked double and George Mettrick's sharp single.

Dudley extinguished that fire by striking out two of the most dangerous Newport batters with the bases loaded. Jimbo Hodges doubled and scored on the only error by either team in the ninth.

MANAGER JOHN THOMPSON'S whoop-andholler Grays came roaring back with 2 in the fourth, 2 in the fifth, 4 great big runs in the seventh and Charley Hardesty's line homer to right in the eighth.
