Pud Fans 15 While Hurling 15-2 Decision Over Pirates

The Pirates scored a pair of runs on a walk and a hit

batsman but couldn't solve Hassell's hurling as the Seadogs took. a 15-2 win to remain undefeated for the season.

Pud used an assortment of speeds to register 15 strikeouts in the seven-inning game.

Beaufort jumped on the Swansboro starter, Perry, for four runs in the first inning and two in the second before he was relieved by righthander Mike! Miller. Miller finished up for the Pirates and was charged with nine runs in five and two-thirds innings.

In the fourth , ming the Pirates pushed across their first run on a hit batsman, a stolen base and an error. They added another in the sixth frame on a walk, a stolen base and a pair of passed balls. Mike Miller scored both of the Swansbore runs.

Pud helped his own cause at the plate with two hits in two times at bat but the big hit of the day was an inside-the-park homerun in the seventh inning by Chuck Lewis. Ray Hassell was also credited with a pair of hits.
