Marshallberg retained its hold on the Tidewater League lead during the weekend with two one-sided victories over Beaufort, winning 13-3 Saturday at Beaufort and triumphing again Sunday at Marshallberg, 8-3.

Again pitcher Johnson of Marshallberg stole the show in both games. Saturday he did not pitch but in the eighth inning he was called in to pinch hit with two on base. Rising to the occasion he pounded out a 400-foot drive to left center that scored both runners and ran himself around the diamond.

Sunday Johnson did another masterful job as he held Beaufort to only four hits while his teammates pounded out nine hits for eight runs and its eleventh victory in 13 starts.

Driver was winning pitcher in Saturday's contest at Beaufort while Piner of Beaufort received credit for the loss. Elvin Davis led Marshallberg's hitting with four for six, two of them doubles. Other heavy hitters for Marshallberg were Olkowski with two for three, one of them a homer, Strickland with two for three and Driver with two for five.

Goodyear stood out at bat for Beaufort with two for four and his base stealing stole the show much of the time. Ray Hassell and Russell with two for five each also helped Beaufort's cause.
