Newport Lassies Take 46-26 Victory Over Richlands Sextet

The Newport Hawks lost to Richlands, 82-74, in overtime Friday night at Newport. The score was tied at 67 all when the regulation time ended. Richlands scored 15 points to Newport's seven in the overtime period.

It was a close fight all the way, with the lead changing hands several times. Richlands held a one-point lead, 22-21, at the end of the first eight minutes of play.

Hold Edge at Half

In the second period Newport moved ahead to hold a three-point edge at the half. The score was 37-34 when the two teams left the court.

Richlands battled back in the third period to out-score the Hawks, 22-16, and take a 56-53 lead as the final quarter began. Newport rallied to gain three points on Richlands and the Hawks managed to tie the score just before the end of the game.

That set the stage for a Richlands rally that produced 15 points in the overtime and gave the visitors an 82-74 victory.

Easy Win

The Newport lassies had considerably less trouble than the Hawks as they won the preliminary contest by a 46-26 margin.

Margaret Lilly scored 27 points for Newport, one more than the entire Richlands team scored. Jenny Lynn Garner scored eight points to rank second in the scoring column for Newport. The other starting forward was Eula Warren.

Foul Line Shots

Coach T. H. McQuaid ordered a full-court press through the entire game. Twenty-eight foul shots were awarded to Pamlico as a result of the aggressive Beaufort style of play. Pamlico cashed in on 18 of their chances from the free throw line. Beaufort hit on seven of nine shots from the line.

The Seadogs have worked on a full-court press all season, even against teams they could handle easily. This shows long-range planning by the coach, who probably sees some tough games coming in tournament play.
