

Blue Devils Lose Final Game With Lejeune Monday, 6-5

The Blue Devils lost a 6-5 decision at Camp Lejeune Monday night, Smyrna's last game of the season.

The visitors opened the first inning with a four-run burst, then went scoreless until the sixth. Ted Lewis, lead-off man, reached first on an error. Danny Lawrence walked.

A single by Tommy McGee scored Ted. Gray Lewis drew a base on balls, and Jimmy Bralford singled in Lawrence and McGee. Gray came home on an overthrow at third.

Lejeune counted two runs in the third inning and two more in the fourth. Terry Lewis walked, stole second and scored on a single by Gray Lewis in the top of the sixth for Smyrna, but the Devilpups countered with another run in the bottom of the inning.

Lejeune claimed the victory in the eighth inning, on a walk, stolen base, fielder's choice and a wild pitch. The winning pitcher was Bullard. He went the distance, striking out 11, walking

eight and giving up five hits.

Terry Lewis took the loss, although Keith Piner started the game and was shuffled in and out. Together, they struck out six, walked 13 and allowed five hits. Piner gave up 12 of the 13 walks, and Lewis hurled the costly wild pitch in the eighth.

Coach Frank Curling reports that the club committed no errors. Lejeune made two fielding

mistakes. The loss gives Smyrna a 3-9 final record.
