

Seadogs Defeat Smyrna In Doubleheader on Friday

Beaufort's Seadogs played their first season games on the newly-painted homecourt Friday night and posted a double victory over Smyrna 56-37 and 52-48.

The feature contest saw the Seadogs move out to an early lead which they never relinquished. At the end of the first quarter Beaufort had a 14-6 lead and at halftime they maintained a 22-15 advantage.

In the third quarter the Seadogs pulled a bit further ahead after Smyrna had gotten as close as four points, 24-20. At the end of the third quarter the Seadogs led 37-27, and in the final quarter Beaufort really pulled away as they started to fast break the tiring team from down east.

Players Foul Out

Smyrna's chances were hurt badly in the early moments of the final canto when Ronald Styron and Ronnie Arthur fouled out of the game. Jimmy Davis was high point maker for the winners with 15. Ed Willis took runner-up honors with 12 markers.

For the losing five Kenny Davis was high with 12 points. Ronnie Arthur and Louis Thomas each had 5 points to share runner-up honors. The preliminary contest was the exciting affair of the evening as the Beaufort sextet moved out to a 14-10 lead at the end of the first quarter, and maintained a 27-24 advantage at halftime.

The third quarter saw the Beaufort girls pour on the steam. They moved well out in front 42-31, but Smyrna put on a last-ditch effort to pull the game out and fell short by four points with Beaufort winning 52-48.

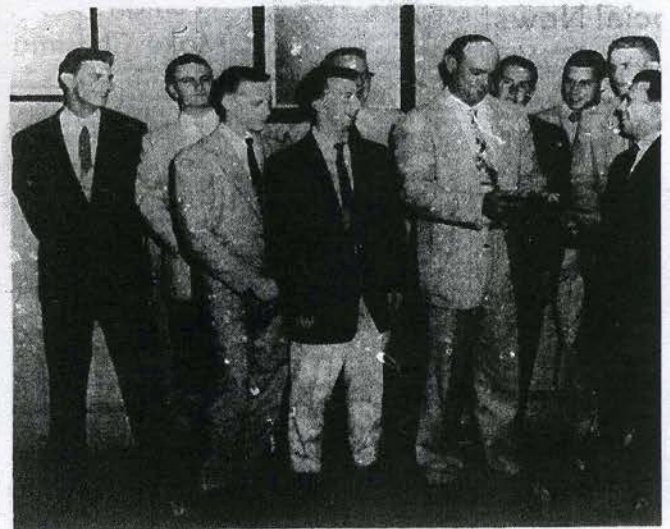
