Sammy Sulter scored four and Dr. Harvey scored one. Officials called 34 fouls during the game and both teams did well from the free throw line. The Seadogs hit 16 of 21 free throws for 76 per cent accuracy and the Pirates hit on 22 of 32 attempts for 69 per cent accuracy.

The Seadogs, who had 21 fouls called against them, used a man-to-man defense all the way. At the end of the game there were four Beaufort men who had four fouls.

Atlantic used a zone defense and had only 13 fouls called. The Pirates were unable to stop the outside shooting of Butch Hassell, though, and when the defense loosened up Purl Hassell was deadly from under the basket.

It was victory number 12 for the Seadogs, who have yet to be defeated this season.

The Swansboro Pirates bested the Newport Hawks in overtime, 61-59, in a real thriller at the Newport gym Friday night. After trailing for most of the game the Hawks came back to tie the score late in the game.

With one second remaining, Newport got possession of the ball and called for time out. The Hawks took the ball at mid-court and a desperation shot came off the backboards just as the buzzer sounded.

Once more the Hawks had possession of the ball with a second to go. Again a final shot missed and the Pirates had earned a 61-59 victory.
