A strong Beaufort team scored regularly Tuesday night to down Swansboro 69 to 36, despite a hefty drive by Swansboro in the first half.

Alton Hill and Ray Hassell mounted up 23 and 20 points respectively to cancel out Swansboro's Ernest Wiggins' 18. Beaufort's steady lead kept up through the first half and then rolled up an impressive 19-20 in the last two quarters.

Swansboro had a depressing third quarter after scoring 23 points before the break between halves, and then faltered in the third, getting only 4 points.

The fourth quarter netted Beaufort 20, while Swansboro delved deep to pull 9 points out of the bag. Backing Hill and Hassell on scoring was Chuck Lewis for Beaufort with 12 points. Swansboro's next highest was Jim Corbett with 7. A total of 36 field goals told the tale for Beaufort, swamping Swansboro's 13.

Free throws contributed little to the final score, running 9-8 on the big side for Beaufort. Score by quarters went 19-11-19-20 for Beaufort and 12-11-4-9 for the boys from the other end of Bogue sound.

On the girls' side, Swansboro made a successful third quarter grab to win, 39-30. On the floor at Beaufort for the home team were Anna Salter who led scoring with 22, and for Swansboro's tops in points, Ginny Hancock with 23. Adding to the total for Beaufort were Janet Leonard with 4 and Carol Betters with 4. Swansboro points besides Hancock's were Barbara Rhue 10, and Nora Miller 6.

Quarters showed 16-3-3-8 for Beaufort and 11-7-12-9 for Swansboro girls. Guards were Freda Garner, Norma Merrill and Judy Pake. On the opponent's side, Nancy Hurst, Linda Jones and Gloria Sanders played guard.

Coastal Plains Tournament Will Open Tuesday

Morehead City and Beaufort will tangle as the two top teams in the Coastal Plains conference tournament which opens at Trenton Tuesday. Respective rank of the two teams has not been assigned as yet, but the teams will be seeded number one and two at the start of conference play.

The conference will extend through the second of March. First night play will pit teams in the four and five spots, three and six spots and the Morehead and Beaufort teams in the semi-finals. Both Morehead City and Beaufort got a bye in the conference organization for preliminary play, according to Eagle coach Gannon Talbert.

Teams in the conference besides Morehead City and Beaufort, are Jones Central of Trenton, Wallace-Rose Hill, Charles B. Aycock of Pikeville, and Pamlico county.

Regular season play ends Saturday when Newport and Smyrna and Morehead City and Jones Central finish their schedule.

Beaufort rolled up an impressive 90 points over a hapless Smyrna team Wednesday night at Smyrna. Smyrna managed to gather 29 points before the game ended.

The Smyrna girls' team fared little better, being beaten by the Beaufort girls 56-38.

Beaufort, led by the scoring of Cary Kirk, Chuck Lewis, Ray Hassell and Alton Hill, got into a comfortable lead in the first period of play, and added at least 20 points per quarter for the rest of the game.

Outstanding in scoring for the Smyrna team was Davis and Jones.

Points made by quarters for Beaufort were 23-22-21-24. Smyrna rallied briefly for a small gain in scoring in the second, getting 7-9-4-7.

Scoring for the Beaufort girls were Anna Salter 25, Janet Leonard 17, Carol Betters 11, and Margaret Merrill 2. Starting guards were Norma Merrill, Judy Pake and Margaret Davis. Later substitutions were Sue Guthrie, Peggy Lewis, Eleanor Patterson, Kandie Smith and Bonnie Merrill.

Smyrna scorers were Alice Chadwick, 21, Patsy Taylor 9, and

Joann Valentine 8. Guards were Becky Brown, Gay Styron and Trudi Gillikin. Subs were Gloria Wiggins and Kay Lewis.

Points by quarters gave Smyrna a strong finish, 7-4-13-14, while Beaufort got 18-12-16-19.
