

Eagles Score 100-37 Victory Over Devilpups Tuesday Night

The unbeaten Morehead City Eagles rolled up their high score of the season Tuesday night at the home court, trampling Camp Lejeune 100-37.

The preliminary contest saw the Eaglettes victorious by a 55-47 score.

Coach Cannon Talbert used his first stringers in the contest until they had answered the crowd's pleas to score 100 points, and then with about 23 seconds left to play, he threw in the subs.

Two of the regulars, J. W. Long and Llewellyn Phillips, fouled out of the contest, and their replacements also shared in the scoring spree.

Bob Salisbury, Lejeune high scorer with 12 points, also fouled out of the game.

The Eagles had a 25-5 lead at the end of the first quarter and extended the advantage to 53-14 at halftime. At the end of three quarters they were ahead 75-25.
