Havelock, Smyrna Remain Unbeaten in County Play

In County League play Sunday Smyrna rocked Newport 19-4 and Havelock edged Salter Path 7-6.

The Smyrna-Newport game, played at Newport, saw Laurie Willis pitch four-hit ball for the Down Easters as they registered their second consecutive win without a loss.

Buck, Lilly and Culpepper all saw action on the mound for Newport with Buck taking the loss.

Crawford Piggott led the offensive parade for Smyrna, getting three doubles and a single in five trips to the plate. Bruce Babbitt contributed a single, double and triple and Alton Paul was credited with three hits. Getting two hits apiece were Jim Parkin, Donnie Davis, Braxton Pines and Louis Thomas.

The highlight of the Havelock-Salter Path contest was a two-run homer by Sonny Fones in the bottom of the fifth inning.

Pitcher Henry Sermons limited Salter Path to five hits but five Havelock errors almost proved his downfall. Havelock managed 10 hits off two Salter Path hurlers, Jarvis Guthrie and Larry Guthrie.

Salter Hurls 2-Hit Shutout

The Beaufort town baseball team scored their third straight win of the season Sunday when they pounded out 18 hits in beating Broad Creek 13-0 in a game played at Broad Creek.

Lefthander Tommy Salter checked the Broad Creek bats on two hits, both singles. The first was a one-bagger by Taylor in the fourth inning and the second was a single by O'Neal in the ninth. Salter struck out 16 men in his nine-inning stint.

Leading the hitting parade for Beaufort were Curt Lancaster, John Hamilton and Jim Fodrie. Lancaster had five hits in six trips to the plate and Hamilton and Fodrie each had a trio of base hits.

By winning, Beaufort remained in the top spot in the league with their record of three wins and no losses while Broad Creek's record is now one win and two losses.
